CHAIRMAN'S **MESSAGE**

During 2023, we participated in more mission trips, hosted visits to the region, and engaged in more in-person meetings which resulted in a successful year of announcements and developing projects.

We had 10 announcements this past year, which represented the creation of over 700 new jobs and over \$900 million in capital investment. Notably, two cities in the region were recognized in a recent report from Area Development. The City of Florence in Florence County was ranked in the top 50 cities nationwide for overall economic growth. Myrtle Beach in Horry County was ranked in the top five cities nationwide for prime workforce. This is a wonderful testament to the strong economic growth and outlook for our region.

At the end of December 2023, employment in the NESA region increased by 3.7% compared to December of 2022 and about 5% compared to December of 2021. We monitored the fluctuations in the unemployment rate throughout the year and we continue to see a downward trend compared to two years ago. At the end of December 2023, the unemployment rate was at 3.7%.

Over the course of the year, we were able to generate 73 new projects that represent a potential capital investment of over \$26 billion and the potential creation of more than 23,500 new jobs.

We implemented an apprenticeship program through Apprenticeship Carolina. This ongoing program will allow us to work with students who are interested in pursuing a career in economic development. Our first apprentice started in November, and we are in the process of bringing on a second apprentice this spring semester.

We appreciate each of our member counties and investors who collaborated to develop great opportunities for our region and communities over the past year. We are excited to continue working with you and seeing another wonderful year in 2024.

REGIONAL ECONOMY


The regional economy proved to be resilient again in 2023. The sustained low unemployment rate, coupled with stable employment figures, modest GDP growth, and increasing wage levels, suggests the region as a whole is poised for continued prosperity. The research team at NESA will continue to monitor the regional economy and keep our partners informed on key economic data and trends as we move into 2024.

Average Annual Wages

Average annual wages in the NESA region was \$46,957 per worker in 2023 as of the third quarter. This is a 4.2% increase from the same quarter a year prior, and a 25.4% increase since 2019.





Real Gross Domestic Product



Real GDP for 2022 in the region was \$32.1 billion dollars. With the exception of 2020, year over year GDP growth has historically been positive. 2022 maintained this trend of growth as it saw an increase of 1.2% from the year prior.

Regional Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate of 14.4% in April 2020 has been in our rearview mirror as we maintained a consistently low unemployment rate as a region (4% average) since March 2021.

The lowest recorded employment this year was still approximately 12,000 more employees than the lowest level recorded in 2020, demonstrating a significant turnaround since the pandemic.


ANNOUNCED JOBS & CAPITAL INVESTMENT BY YEAR

BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT


Our business development activities are designed to bring opportunities for job creation and capital investment to the region. These activities include building relationships with companies, consultants, brokers, the South Carolina Department of Commerce, NESA county economic developers, and other allies. Our business development staff met with hundreds of company executives, brokers, and consultants on multiple marketing missions in 2023.

Our nine-county region had another busy year in 2023. There were ten announcements across the region, representing just under one billion dollars in new capital investment and just over 700 new jobs. Our project pipeline was also the largest it's ever been, representing more than \$26 billion in potential capital investment and more than 23,900 potential new jobs.

PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT

The NESA Executive Committee annually authorizes grants to our county partners and allies to maximize the regional impact of key projects which align with NESA's mission and that help to impact other economic development efforts throughout the region. Our county partners each have the opportunity to submit grant applications for both our County Grants and High Impact Grant programs each year. In 2022, the NESA Executive Committee approved grants totaling \$433,000. The following represents the grants that were awarded:

CORPORATION

was awarded a NESA High Impact Grant to assist with the extension of a natural gas line in Ascott Valley Industrial Park.

CHESTERFIELD COUNTY

was awarded a NESA County Grant to assist with the cost of completing due diligence on Alligator Industrial Park.

RESEARCH

NESA continues to be the premier destination for regional economic information. NESA has access to numerous information sources providing demographic, workforce, and economic data, among others. The data NESA can provide is useful for a variety of applications: industry recruitment, industry expansion and retention, and community development. These efforts proved vital to our county allies in particular, as the research department completed over 373 activities in 2023 alone with the majority of efforts focused in research, data analysis, and dissemination.

Introducing NESA's New Apprentice

Luke Godbold is originally from Marion, S.C. and currently resides in Florence, S.C. He is a senior at Francis Marion University where he is pursuing a degree in economics.

Luke started working with the NESA team in November as part of a new apprenticeship program created through Apprenticeship Carolina for students who are interested in economic development.
